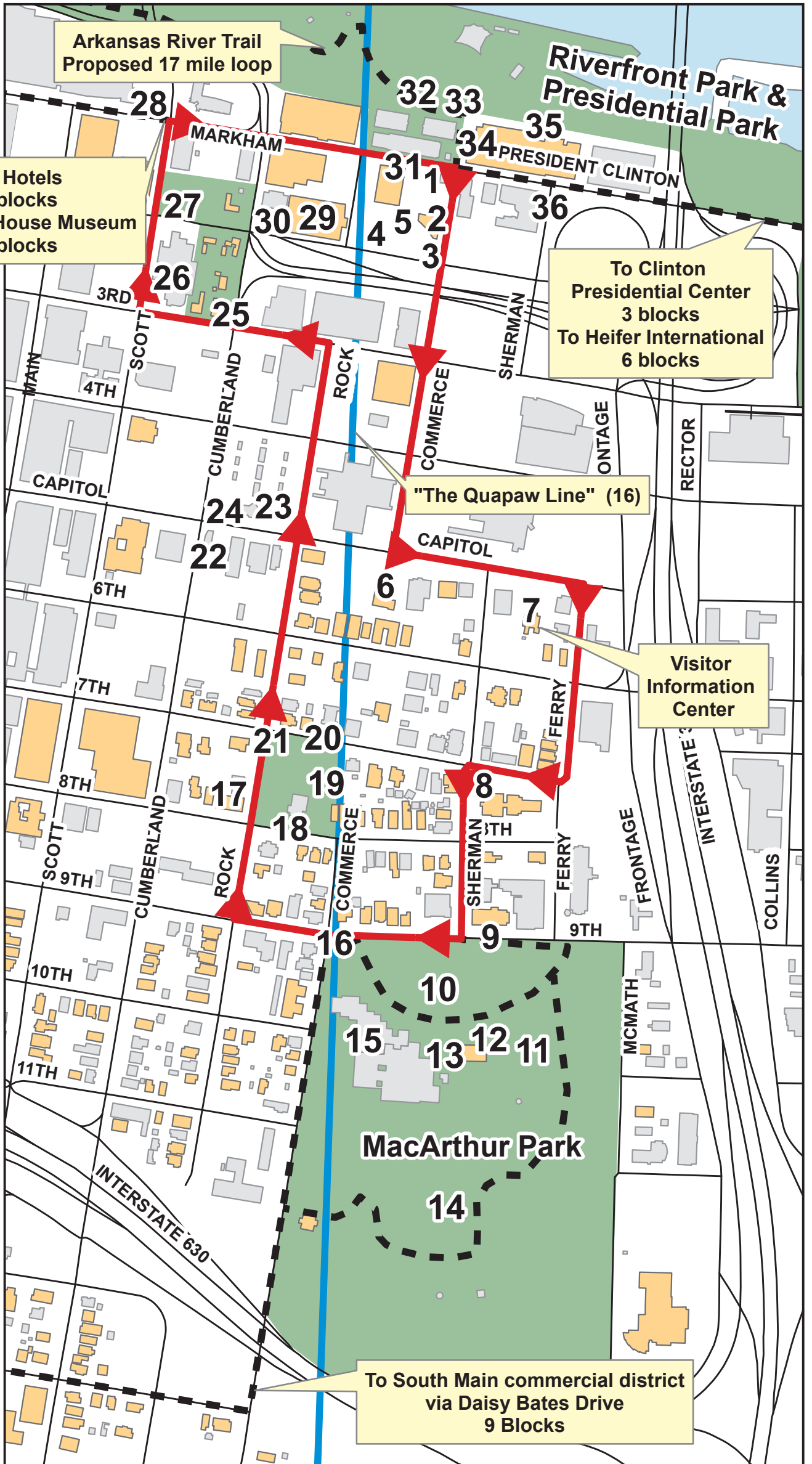

Birthplace of General Douglas MacArthur. Exhibits feature artifacts, photographs, weapons, documents, and uniforms to portray Arkansas's military history.

15	<b>Arkansas Arts Center</b>	501 East 9th Street	Museum	An art museum with a children's theatre and a studio school. Its mission is to ensure that learning, inspiration and creative expression in the arts flourish throughout Arkansas, for people of all ages and backgrounds.
16	Quapaw Line Historic Marker & Quapaw Line	9th and Commerce	Marker	1818-1824 The dividing line between the newly platted town of Little Rock and the Quapaw Nation. The Quapaw Indians were moved out of Arkansas in 1824.
