

1 **Section 3.** Expenditure of Lost Revenue on Governmental Services. It is the intent of the Board of
2 Directors that funds from the second tranche of the ARPA Funds be prioritized and expended for
3 government services as follows:

- 4 a) Little Rock Fire Department Capital Needs: Including a new station with a residential look
5 and feel in West Little Rock and an updated apparatus bay at Station 16: Estimated at Two
6 Million, One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,100,000.00)
- 7 b) Public Works Capital Needs: Estimated at Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00)
- 8 c) Information Technology Upgrades: Estimated at Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
9 (\$200,000.00)
- 10 d) Drainage Projects as Targeted Community Development: Estimated at One Million Dollars
11 (\$1,000,000.00)
- 12 e) Infrastructure as Economic Development: Estimated at Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
13 (\$750,000.00)
- 14 f) Capital Improvements at Museum of Discovery, which is a component unit of the City of Little
15 Rock: Three Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$375,000.00)
- 16 g) Capital Improvements at City-Owned Baseball Fields located at 2500 Cantrell Road, also
17 known as Junior Deputy Baseball Park: Eight Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand (\$875,000.00)

18 **Section 6.** Compliance with the American Rescue Plan Act. The City will ensure compliance with
19 prevailing Federal Law, regulations, bidding requirements, and guidance, at the time the funds are
20 committed to expenditures.

21 **Section 7. Severability.** In the event any title, section, paragraph, item, sentence, clause, phrase, or
22 word of this resolution is declared or adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration or
23 adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of the resolution which shall remain in full force and
24 effect as if the portion so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional was not originally a part of the
25 resolution.

26 **Section 8. Repealer.** All laws, ordinances, resolutions, or parts of the same that are inconsistent with
27 the provisions of this resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
